


What do you notice about the place where Handa lives? Does fruit grow there easily? Which fruits in the story do we grow in our country? Which fruits need a warmer place to grow? Have you ever picked fruit or vegetables before? <p>Knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> People grow food in gardens and farms. 	<p>Skill</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Talk about people who help us stay healthy (doctors, nurses, farmers). <p>Prompts</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Why is spring a good time for new growth?
