Reading is the key that unlocks the curriculum

In Years 2 - 6, Reading Plus is an important programme used at Forest of Galtres to support your child's reading development in a fun, structured and engaging way. It helps to build reading fluency and comprehension, boosting children's confidence and supporting their learning across the curriculum. To gain the full benefit, children are expected to complete six tasks each week. This includes four tasks in school and two tasks at home with a mixture of reading, vocabulary and visual skills activities.

Regular use of Reading Plus has a positive impact on children's reading stamina, understanding and enjoyment of reading. Reading Plus sessions can be recorded in children's reading records and we ask that reading is logged each week. Children in Years 1-6 should record reading at least three times per week and children in EYFS twice per week.

Thank you for your continued support in helping your child develop strong reading habits at home.
