Thank you to Mrs Lee and Mrs Doughty for supporting the children at this event.

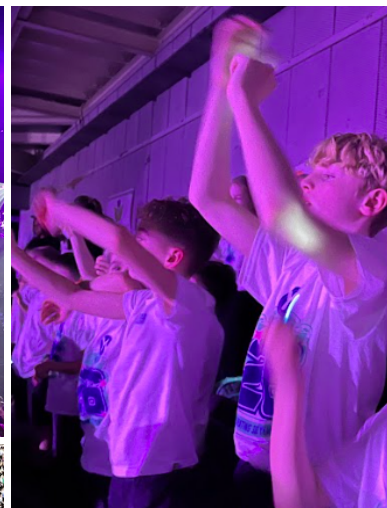
